Sellicks Hill Quarry



When did the quarry start and why is it important?

The Sellicks Hill Quarry began operation in 1973 and has 150 years of resources remaining.

The quarry is located approximately 3km southeast of Aldinga Beach, and the quarry site covers over 260 hectares. The quarry is considered a state strategic asset because of its proximity to Adelaide and the quality of its reserve.

How is the quarry operated and regulated?

The quarry operates under a Mine Operating Plan (MOP) approved by the Department for Energy and Mining (DEM) and is licensed by the South Australian Environment Protection Authority (SA EPA).

As part of our commitment to responsible environmental management, we have an approved Dust Management Plan (DMP) and a Trigger Action Response Plan (TARP) in place.

These plans help us monitor dust levels and respond proactively to minimise our impact on the surrounding community and environment.

The quarry is licensed to operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, current operations typically run from 5:30am to 4:00pm for day shift and 4:00pm to 4:00am for afternoon shift, with limited activity on Saturdays and no operations on Sundays.

What products are made from the quarry and what is it used for?

The quarry manufactures high quality materials for the construction, concrete and asphalt industries.



Aggregates used for concrete, asphalt, railway ballast, drainage, decorative landscaping



Road base used for road construction, driveways and pathways, underfloor fill, car parks, decorative landscaping.



Sand used for concrete production, asphalt production, paving, underfloor fill, decorative landscaping.



Other specialty products created for decorative landscaping, gabion baskets, seawalls, bank stabilisation, environmental remediation (waterways).

Our products have been used in projects large and small. One of our quarry's recent major projects was the Main South Road duplication project, with the quarry providing more than 1 million tonnes of materials. Some other examples are the Aldinga Superschool, Seaford Rail Extension and Northern Connector.

Sellicks Quarry also has an established concrete plant which services the surrounding areas.

Sellicks Concrete Plant supplies concrete for house slabs, driveways, footpaths, and kerbing to local residents for both new builds and renovation projects.
